BlueOne[™] should be placed in a bright spot and should not be allowed to dry out. Produced in 6 and 10.5 cm pots.

It should be placed in a sunny spot. Dragon Skin has high ornamental value, is decorative alone or together with other plants, and is suitable for plant arrangements.

Description: A plant with a fine appearance, with slender, white-speckled leaves. Gasteria pulchel requires only moderate watering and fertiliser. Available in 7 and 9 cm sizes.

Description: Gasteria smokey is a highly compact and robust plant. Gasteria Smokey is easy to look after, and can withstand both drying-out and overwatering without this affecting the plant. It is available in 7 and 9 cm.



HibisQs[®] GardiFlora[™] Zefyr(pbr) should be placed in a bright spot, but tolerates both sun, rain and wind, and provides ornamental value with its orange flowers. It is designed for modern consumers who wish to have a tropical and exotic element outdoors. HibisQs[®] GardiFlora[™] Zefyr(pbr) is an alternative to late planting-out after 1 June. The name Zefyr comes from the Greek god Zephyr, "the western wind that ripens the grain"; the plant's orange flowers are reminiscent of ripe cornfields.

Description: Carmen Madigan has been developed through countless hybrids of existing Madigan varieties. The dramatic red colour of the rose, together with its exciting fragrance, give it unique romantic possibilities of use, and its colour and scent combination also provide a high ornamental value.

Rosa hybrid – Chantalle Kordana (KORpot031)

Description: Chantalle Kordana (KORpot031) was bred by targeted crossing and testing, focusing on durability, decorative value and cultivation properties. It has large, romantic soft pink buds. It should be watered in the saucer, with the excess water poured off when the rose has absorbed what it needs. The rose should be placed in a bright spot, but must not be allowed to dry out. Chantalle Kordana looks well as a single plant in a suitable pot cover, and placing several in a basket has an overwhelming effect.

Once it has finished blooming indoors it can be planted out in pots or beds, where after pruning it will flower again and again. It can overwinter outside if it is kept sheltered from black frost.

Season: All year.



Rosa hybrid – Infinity Rose™

Grower: Roses Forever ApS – <u>www.roses-forever.dk</u>

Description: With Infinity[™], Roses Forever ApS presents something unique in potted roses. Infinity[™] has large, well-shaped flowers (7 cm in diameter) and very strong growth, as well as an extremely long durability for each flower, which last for five weeks or more. The leaves are dark and extra thick, so they help to prevent evaporation and drying out. It has a light rose scent.

Infinity[™] combines the extra-long durability and thick foliage of the cut rose with the compact and dense growth of the potted rose. Infinity[™] is especially suitable for interior decoration due to its extremely long durability, but it is also suitable for planting out in pots and beds. The plant is winter-hardy.

Rosa hybrid – 'Jennifer Madigan'

Description: The rose was developed through countless hybrids of existing Madigan varieties, and today there are very few varieties of the Elvira range that do not derive from our own breeding. The new aspect of this rose is its large flower and exciting scent, which, together with its pink colour, gives it a high decorative value.

Rosa hybrid – Kardinal Kordana (KORpot026)



Grower: Rosa-Danica A/S – www.rosa-danica.dk

Description: Kardinal Kordana (KORpot026) was bred by targeted crossing and testing, focusing on durability, decorative value and cultivation properties. It has large flowers with a bright red colour, and dark foliage. It should be watered in the saucer, with the excess water poured off when the rose has absorbed what it needs. The rose should be placed in a bright spot, but must not be allowed to dry out. Kardinal Kordana is suitable for placing in a basket, possibly with other products.

Once it has finished blooming indoors it can be planted out in pots or beds, where after pruning it will flower again and again. It can overwinter outside if it is kept sheltered from black frost.

Season: All year.



Rosa hybrid – Roses Forever[®] El Paso™

Grower: Rosa ApS – <u>www.rosa.dk</u>

Description: El Paso [™] is a new variant which has a lower growth with large flowers in a stronger orange colour. El Paso[™] should be placed in a bright spot and kept reasonably moist. El Paso[™] can be planted in pots and beds, either after flowering indoors, or immediately. May be planted out from May to September.

Rosa hybrid – Roses Forever[®] Maasland™

Description: Maasland[™] has extra-large, bright red flowers with a diameter of 7 cm, and very glossy dark foliage. For the best results, Maasland[™] should be placed in a bright spot indoors and kept reasonably moist. Maasland[™] can be planted in pots and beds, either after flowering indoors, or immediately. May be planted out from May to September.

Rosa hybrid – Roses Forever[®] Pink Roma™

Description: Pink Roma[™] has pretty pink/rose-coloured, well-shaped flowers which are 6 cm in diameter. Like the familiar black Roma, Roma Pink[™] has glossy, dark, healthy foliage, which gives the plant an exclusive look. For the best results, Pink Roma[™] should be placed in a bright spot indoors and kept reasonably moist. Maasland can be planted in pots and beds, either after flowering indoors, or immediately. May be planted out from May to September.

Rosa hybrid – Tatjana Kordana (KORpot028)

Grower: Rosa-Danica A/S – <u>www.rosa-danica.dk</u>

Description: Tatjana Kordana (KORpot028) was bred by targeted crossing and testing, focusing on durability, decorative value and cultivation properties. It has large flowers with a bright red colour, and dark foliage. It should be watered in the saucer, with the excess water poured off when the rose has absorbed what it needs. The rose should be placed in a bright spot, but must not be allowed to dry out. Like other Kordana roses, Tatjana is suitable both as a single plant in a pot cover, or in a basket – perhaps with other products. Once it has finished blooming indoors it can be planted out in pots or beds, where after pruning it will flower again and again. It can overwinter outside if it is kept sheltered from black frost.

Season: All year.

Saintapulia ionantha – Saintpaulia Bells



Grower: Kærby ApS – <u>www.livingcolours.dk</u>

Description: After nine years, Kærby has succeeded in producing a Saint Paulia series with small bell flowers, which gives Saint Paulia a completely new look. With the new Saintpaulia Bells, Kærby aims to appeal to a younger segment, as the traditional Saint Paulia is often associated with the older segment.

Season: All year

Sedum hakonense – 'Chocolate Ball'

Grower: Råhøj – <u>www.rahoj.dk</u>

Description: 'Chocolate Ball' comes from the mountains of southern Honshu in Japan, and has a chocolate-brown colour. The plant can be used in the crocks of late



summer/autumn, or as ground cover. It flowers every second year, and tolerates both sun and shade as well as drying out, but not over-watering.

Season: Weeks 29-40



Sedum ochroleucum – 'Green Ball'

Grower: Råhøj – <u>www.rahoj.dk</u>

Description: 'Green Ball' is ideal both for the crocks of late summer/autumn, and as ground cover in beds. It flowers in its second year with yellow flowers that attract butterflies and bumblebees. It tolerates both sun and shade, and can withstand drying out, but not over-watering.

Season: Weeks 29-40



Sedum rupestre – 'Blue Cushion'

Grower: Råhøj – <u>www.rahoj.dk</u>

Description: Great ornamental value in the pots of late summer/autumn. Gives life to a pot arrangement with its upright growth, which also brings a little wildness. Can tolerate drying out, but not overwatering. Suitable for pots or rock gardens. Can tolerate shade as well as full sun.

Sedum rupestre – 'Lemon Ball'

Description: Great ornamental value in the pots of late summer/autumn. Lights up a pot fantastically with its lovely spring-green colour. Can tolerate drying out, but not overwatering. Suitable for pots or rock gardens. Tolerates both shade and full sun.

Season: Weeks 29-40

Trifolium repens – 'Isabella'



Grower: Råhøj – <u>www.rahoj.dk</u>

Description: 'Isabella' is the latest product of our own breeding programme. Named after Princess Isabella, it was 'christened' by HRH Crown Princess Mary herself. Looks fantastic in pots, and has great decorative value from early spring until well into winter. In a mild winter, it will adorn the garden all winter long. It withers at -10 C, but will return in early spring. The plant is good at combating weeds in beds, but spreads extensively. Cleanses the air of CO2.

Should be watered regularly, but if it dries out, it can easily be watered again. If it

grows too long or dries out too much, it can be pruned right back to the ground, after which it will grow back again with a fine appearance. May be placed in shade or full sun.

Season: Weeks 10-40

Trifolium repens – 'Josephine'



Grower: Råhøj – <u>www.rahoj.dk</u>

Description: New variety with new markings on the leaves, with the lines going from side to side, as opposed to lengthwise, as in the existing varieties. Trifolium 'Josephine' has been bred by Råhøj, and is named after Princess Josephine of Denmark. It has ornamental value from early spring right up to late autumn, and can be used both in crocks and directly in beds. It can be placed in sunlight or in the shade. It is an air-freshening plant.

Season: Weeks 9-40
